The past few months have been a bevy of activity for Literacy Solutions NY and the Haverstraw Literacy Zone. HLZ ESOL classes began on September 27th in the space generously donated by Benito Herrero, Principal of Haverstraw Elementary School. This year the demand for classes increased significantly. In response, we were pleased to add an additional USCFI class, our basic literacy course, bringing our total number of classes to 5, with an enrollment of over 140 students.

In addition to classes 4 evenings a week, the HLZ also offers case management to students, their families, and the community at large. In collaboration with Haverstraw Center, we offer presentations to students and the HC parents group on the first Wednesday of each month. Topics are determined in consultation with the parents.

On November 1, the Haverstraw Literacy Zone hosted its first "Job Fair" at Rockland Community College-Haverstraw Campus. Students, parents, local residents, and anyone interested in speaking with local employers were invited to attend. This was a unique opportunity for anxious job seekers to speak with prospective employers in a professional, yet friendly, atmosphere. We were delighted to have 9 prospective employers and over 70 job seekers participate. We look forward to hosting another job fair in 2017. Thank you to Rockland Community College and Rockland **County Career Center for their** assistance with this event.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER PATRICIA P. RAJALA, PRES/CEO LITERACY VOLUNTEERS OF AMERICA FOUNDER RUTH I. COLVIN CELEBRATES 100 YEARS!

Dear Friends:

I was privileged to attend LVA Founder Ruth J. Colvin's 100th birthday party in Syracuse on November 18. 300 of her closest friends gathered in the Syracuse to celebrate and honor this remarkable woman who continues to serve on the Board of Literacy Central NY, write books, train tutors, work adult educators in China, out at the gym, and play golfseemingly all at the same time. I first met Ruth and her husband Bob in 1980, at the Literacy Volunteers of America National Convention in Harrisburg, 18 years old.

In 1962, LVA's founding year, Ruth was shocked to discover that over 11,000 Onondaga County residents, home of the City of Syracuse, could not read. In response, Ruth and some friends from Church Women United, with the collaboration and guidance of

Syracuse University School of Education, created a program that used trained volunteers to work with adult learners. The program quickly spread around the state and the county. grand ballroom of the Hotel As the program grew in the U.S., Ruth and Bob took their literacy expertise on the road, visiting over 80 countries around the globe. They worked with local Angola, and India, to name but three, to create local language adult literacy programs. Ruth convinced then-First Lady Barbara Bush to create her **Bush Family Literacy Founda-**Pa. The organization was then tion, and during the administration of President George W. Bush, she was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. our nation's highest civilian honor. In addition to this prestigious award, Ruth is also the recipient of dozens of honorary doctorates from colleges and

The organization that Ruth founded in 1962 has helped hundreds of thousands of educationally disadvantaged adults achieve their goal of English literacy. Thousands of tutors have been recruited and trained to work one-on-one with adult students.

But Ruth Colvin also created an organization in which hundreds of professionals like me have found not just employment, but a calling-a vocation, if you willto help our students improve their lives and the lives of their children, and their community. through the gift of literacy.
