This year, Finkelstein Memorial Library is celebrating its centennial year of service to Rockland residents. The library opened this milestone year by doing what it does so well: focusing on the needs of local residents. It inaugurated its centennial by holding monthly gift basket drawings for library patrons. It also forgave fines during amnesty week.

On April 23, FML is hosting a "Centennial Celebration Ribbon Cutting Ceremony", an all-day event celebrating its unique multicultural community of Spring Valley. FML, like all libraries, is filled with a wonderful array of books — history, math, science, fiction, non-fiction, research—but it is also filled with a host of interactive activities for adults and children.

FML is also home to ESOL classes and citizenship preparation classes offered by Literacy Solutions, NY.

One of the ESOL classes is a unique "women only " created to meet the cultural needs of a group of refugee women from Yemen. Many had little or no education in their native language, but were verv eager to learn the language of their adopted homeland. They attended classes faithfully, formed study groups with classmates, and worked tirelessly to achieve their goal of English literacy. Many have far exceeded their goalssome have achieved citizenship, a driver's license, or have begun taking

advanced classes. The women have also benefited from case management services, and have participated in workshops and seminars focusing on home and community safety, heath care, domestic violence, and immigration issues.

We are proud to have FML as our partner in the classes and other services that we offer. Without their generosity, it would be extremely difficult to meet the needs of all the residents who reach out to us.

We congratulate Finkelstein Memorial Library on celebrating its centennial, and thank them for their unwavering commitment to serving all the residents of their diverse community.
