The Empire Justice Center, a notfor-profit law firm, is an invaluable resource for New Yorkers in need of legal assistance, and is a great asset to the Rockland Office for New Americans.

The goal and long-term vision of the Empire Justice Center is to be the statewide leader working to achieve social and economic justice for people in New York who are poor, disabled or disenfranchised.

The firm's President & CEO, Anne Erickson, has been with the firm since 1989. She began as a policy analyst and was appointed President in 2000. She has guided the firm through a merger with the Public Interest Law Firm of Rochester, expanding its White Plains office, and opening a new office on Long Island. She is a dynamic leader who has combined the two organizations into a legal resource for those without resources.

Ms. Erickson has assembled a talented management team, aligned into five major practice groups:

- Consumer, Housing, C.A.S.H. and Community Development
- Civil Rights
- Education and Employment
- Disability Benefits
- Immigrants and Immigrant Rights
- Public Benefits, Health and Family

Under the auspices of the New York State Office for New Americans, we are privileged to have the Empire Justice Center as our legal partner with our Rockland Office for New Americans program. We are extremely fortunate to have

Linda Bennett-Rodriguez as the attorney assigned to the Rockland Office for New Americans.

Following graduation from Pace University School of Law, she joined the Empire Justice Center. Ms. Bennett -Rodriguez is a talented attorney who has dedicated herself to championing the rights of immigrants. Our program participants may not be able to afford private legal representation, but they benefit from the legal expertise of an attorney who truly cares about protecting and defending the rights of immigrants.
