

<u>HLZ BEGINS</u> <u>7th Year of Services to</u> <u>Haverstraw Residents</u>

The Haverstraw Literacy Zone, an integral component of Literacy Solutions NY (LSNY), inaugurated services for Village residents in 2013. At that time. few people in the community knew about Literacy Solutions. Agency staff was focused on meeting community residents, and developing a bond with both residents and service providers. Since those early days. LSNY has become a "household name", expanded services, added programs, and established a LSNY Rockland County administrative center at 63 New Main Street.

The newest LSNY program, the Rockland Office for New Americans, while not an HLZ program, is under the Literacy Solutions umbrella and works closely with the Literacy Zone to publicize services including citizenship applications and legal assistance to immigrants throughout the county.

All services provided are free of charge and without regard to immigration status.

Services provided by the Haverstraw Literacy Zone include:

40 Year's of Dedication to Bringing Literacy to the "Hardest to Reach and Hardest to Teach" Pat Rajala

Patricia Rajala, Pres/CEO of Literacy Solutions, earned her undergraduate degree from Marymount College, Tarrytown, and her Masters in Business Administration from Stanford University. But her love of literacy and education is a product of her heritage. Her mother, Patricia, was an Elementary School Teacher; her father, Peter, a Professor of Economics at Fordham University.

In 1979, with a toddler in tow and one on the way, Pat decided to take on an additional responsibility: volunteering with Literacy Volunteers of Mount Vernon. Through that involvement, Pat began what would become her life-long passion: bringing literacy services to the "hardest to reach and hardest to teach"—adult basic education students, both native born and new arrivals, many of whom had little access to education in their formative years.

During the next few years, she joined the Board of Directors of Literacy Volunteers of Mount Vernon, and helped guide the merger of 6 local literacy agencies into Literacy Volunteers of Westchester. That organization, along with Literacy Volunteers of Rockland, is now know as Literacy Solutions NY, Inc. (LSNY).

In 1992, Pat was asked to become the new Executive Director, the position she holds today.

Pat's vision and leadership has enabled the agency to add new programs, the Haverstraw Literacy Zone in 2013, the Rockland Office for New Americans in 2016, the Rockland Golden Door in 2019, as well as develop English Language curriculum "U.S. Civics for Immigrants: From Native Language to English Literacy", and industry based curricula to provide employment centered ESOL for hospitality industry employees.

In a time when people rarely spend their career with one company, Literacy Solutions is grateful that Pat Rajala has chosen to share her expertise and love of literacy with LSNY and it students for over 40 years. Thank you Pat, for all you have done to help so many! Here's to 40 more!!!

<u>Posthumous Honor Bestowed on</u> <u>Carolina A. Rojas, A Revered Educator</u>

Carolina A. Rojas was born in 1932 in the Dominican Republic. The second of 7 children, she was raised in Moca, a city with a population of just under 62,000 people. At the young age of 22, Carolina decided to share her love of education with local children. When she walked into class on her first day as an elementary school teacher, she began the career that would span 32 years.

In her late 20s', she married and eventually had 4 children, 2 girls & 2 boys. Her daughters, Literacy Solutions' Academic Coordinator Ana Diaz and Lead Case Manager Gricelda Serrano share Carolina's love for education. While raising her family, she continued her teaching career.

At the age of 55, following 32 years of sharing her knowledge with her young students, Carolina Rojas retired and began spending much of her time with her children in the U.S. Although she no longer taught, her community and her students never forgot all she gave to them.

Following her death in 2014, the community came together to search for a fitting way to honor her.

In 2019, her 4 children joined El Caimito Moca community to celebrate the life of Carolina A. Rojas.



On October 18, 2019, family, friends, and community came together to re-name the school where she spent 32 years the "Centro Educativo Prof. Carolina Antonia Rojas". A fitting tribute to a woman who educated thousands of children in her native Dominican Republic.

Haverstraw Elementary School: A Community Resource

When we see the name "Haverstraw Elementary School" (HES) we think of smiling young faces, not adults returning to school. But, if HES Principal Benito Herrero has his way, the school will open its doors each night to adults returning to school to improve their English proficiency, study for the high school equivalency exam, prepare for the US Citizenship written and verbal exams, and other adult education options.
