<u>Haverstraw Literacy Zone Celebrates</u> <u>10 Years of Service to the Village of Haverstraw</u>

<u>10 Years & Going Strong</u> This section usually lists services provided by the Haverstraw Literacy Zone, (HLZ) but for our 10th Anniversary, we want to focus on those who have support-

focus on those who have supported the Haverstraw Literacy Zone since it was just an idea posed by Pat Rajala, recently retired LSNY Pres/CEO. Pat learned of the "Literacy Zone" concept through her extensive work with adult literacy in New York State. "Literacy Zones" were developed by the NYS Education Department to bring not only literacy services, but comprehensive case management services to close the achievement gap in communities having concentrated poverty and limited literacy and/ or English proficiency. The Village of Haverstraw was identified as such a community.

Pat knew that she wanted Literacy Solutions to bring these services to the residents of the Village of Haverstraw!! To do so , required two elements: 1) approval of the Village of Haverstraw; and 2) finding a home base within the Village.

Village approval was quickly attained when Mayor Michael Kohut welcomed the Haverstraw Literacy Zone to the Village with open arms. Without Mayor Kohut's approval, the HLZ would not be in the Village of Haverstraw. We are deeply grateful to Mayor Kohut & the Board of Trustees for welcoming LSNY to the Village of Haverstraw. It has been out privilege to serve the residents since 2013 & we look forward to continuing to be a presence in the Village for many years to come. <u>Thank you Mayor</u> <u>Kohut, Village Trustees</u>,

Finding a home base could have been a major problem, but Marion Breland, Executive Director of Haverstraw Center stepped up immediately and offered the HLZ space in Haverstraw Center. Literacy Solutions has been serving the literacv needs of native born and recent arrivals for over 40 years. The agency is focused on addressing the literacy needs of adults anxious to improve their English skills. Currently, individuals from over 38 countries around the world participate in our classes and tutoring sessions. This year, LSNY is providing ESOL classes to over 225 adult learners in Rockland County and over 125 in Westchester County. In addition to our adult ESOL classes. we also offer one-toone tutoring sessions

provided by highly skilled volunteer tutors; the majority of whom are retired professionals eager to share their expertise with adult learners. The work that Literacy Solutions does is very dear to me. In the early days of my career in the US, I worked as a GED center administrator and a Spanish teacher in New York City. I witnessed first hand the value and importance of adults having the opportunity to access educational resources, particularly literacy services, whether they were native born English speakers or recent arrivals from nations around the world.

Now, working with Literacy Solutions, I have an opportunity to work with an organization that not only provides educational resources to adults, but offers participants the opportunity to develop the skills needed to overcome life's daily challenges. LSNY provides workshops on topical issues including employment research; resume preparation; and financial literacy. LSNY is proud to have the opportunity to serve the residents of Rockland and Westchester counties.

<u>Meet Richard Sena</u> <u>Trustee & Commissioner of Youth & Family Services</u> <u>Village of Haverstraw</u>

Richard Sena, a Rockland County resident and successful business owner for over 40 years, and has been a resident of the Village of Haverstraw since 2020. He has been involved with local not-for-profit organizations for many years in an effort to support organizations that make a difference in residents' lives and promote the positive aspects of the Village of Haverstraw. Examples of Richard's not-for-profit involvement include Haverstraw RiverWide Arts Fund, a sponsor of the fun-filled and highly successful "Haverstraw Food Crawl", which at Richard's suggestion, became incorporated in 2016; and the Haverstraw Brick Museum, a wonderful source of Village history dating back generations. The Brick Museum tells the history of the industry when 40 brick factories employed thousands of local residents, the majority of whom were immigrants. The Museum is open to the public and provides great insight into the changing face of the Village through the years. In 2016 Richard was asked to join the board of the Brick Museum, and just a year later he was elected board President of the organization. He continues in that role today.

Richard began attending Village Board Meeting s to gain a better understanding of the inner workings of the Village, and found he enjoyed the interaction between Village residents and the Board Members. In April of 2020 a Board of Trustees vacancy occurred, and Mayor Kohut appointed Richard to fill the vacancy. Each Village Trustee is assigned a specific area of responsibility for Village operations. Richard has been assigned as Commissioner of Youth & Family Services. In that role, he works very closely with Haverstraw Center to insure that local families, children and youth have access to diversified services designed to help them overcome the challenges they face on a daily basis. Richard thoroughly enjoys living and working in the Village of Haverstraw, and is very proud to be a Village of Haverstraw Trustee.
